Out of Left Field

Sometimes I think that there isn't enough time in Lent to get ready for the Easter Season. With all my good intentions to allow more time for quiet and prayer, I still find myself rushing to fit it all in. Similarly, with all the focused attention on the Easter event it can be something right out of "left field" (an American baseball term, referring to something coming from unexpected or unplanned source) that puts you in mind of what it about to take place.

Having been caught in traffic just before Easter. the words of a song on the radio slowly began to impinge on my consciousness: 'Wash, wash me clean/ Mend my wounded seams/ Cleanse my tarnished dreams/ Swim, swim through my veins/ Drown me in your reign'.

It was a K.D Lang love song but it took on a deeper meaning for me. In just a few words it captured the essence of Christ's transforming love for the whole world. It reminded me that Easter is a celebration of Christ's forgiving, healing, empowering and invincible presence. At the Vigil we sing: 'this is the night when Christians everywhere, washed clean of sin ... are restored to grace and grow together in holliness'.

Easter is the great Christian season of hope and promise especially for those who feel most undeserving and estranged. We should never forget that desperate and broken people came to the tomb on Easter morning. The first was a woman, a social outcast, and then came those who had lost courage, disciples who had deserted Jesus in his hour of need, Peter who had three times denied him. They came daring to hope still for forgiveness, desperate to be washed clean and mended and they were not disappointed. Jesus died, in agony and abandonment, but suddenly the grave was empty. Christ had risen and the blood of his despondent followers suddenly raced with the expectation of his return. Peter saw and believed. Mary saw and believed. We can believe because of what our brothers and sister, weak sinful people like ourselves did 2000 years ago.

Thomas Carlyle once wrote: 'The tragedy of life is not so much what we suffer, but rather what we miss'. Like the disciples, we can become so preoccupied with our own troubles that we risk missing the signs of resurrection all around us - the laughter of a child, an offer to help, a friendly phone call, even a K.D. Lang lyric in maddening, snail-paced traffic! *Fr. Peter* 

During the month of May we draw attention in a particular way to the crime of domestic violence. The Church teaches and provides support in the face of this tragic human experience.

#### FIRST READING

Acts 14:21-27

◆ GOSPEL: John 13:31-35

They assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them.

Paul and Barnabas went back through Lystra and Iconium to Antioch. They put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith. 'We all have to experience many hardships' they said 'before we enter the kingdom of God.' In each of these churches they appointed elders, and with prayer and fasting they commended them to the Lord in whom they had come to believe.

They passed through Pisidia and reached Pamphylia. Then after proclaiming the word at Perga they went down to Attalia and from there sailed for Antioch, where they had originally been commended to the grace of God for the work they had now completed.

On their arrival they assembled the church and gave an account of all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith to the pagans.

#### **SECOND READING** Revelation 21:1-5

He will wipe away all the tears from their eyes.

I, John, saw a new heaven and a new earth; the first heaven and the first earth had disappeared now, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the holy city, and the new Jerusalem, coming down from God out of heaven, as beautiful as a bride all dressed for her husband. Then I heard a loud voice call from the throne, 'You see this city? Here God lives among men. He will make his home among them; they shall be his people, and he will be their God; his name is God-with-them. He will wipe away all tears from their eyes; there will be no more death, and no more mourning or sadness. The world of the past has gone.'

Then the One sitting on the throne spoke: 'Now I am making the whole of creation new'.

#### **GOSPEL**

John 13:31-35

I give you a new commandment: love one another.

When Judas had gone Jesus said: 'Now has the Son of Man been glorified, and in him God has been glorified. If God has been glorified in him, God will in turn glorify him in himself, and will glorify him very soon. My little children, I shall not be with you much longer. I give you a new commandment: love one another; just as I have loved you, you also must love one another. By this love you have for one another, everyone will know that you are my disciples'.
